In Brief

Sin (both original and our own) places an immeasurable debt between us and God that we as humans cannot pay. We must be justified (made right) and sanctified (made holy) in order to be with God in heaven, but we cannot do this on our own. The Old Testament teach us that God's people are incapable of perfectly fulfilling the Old Law and becoming righteous on their own. Out of His great love and mercy God sends Jesus to save us. Through the Paschal Mystery, Christ pays our debt and merits (earns) for us the grace necessary for salvation. This grace is applied to us through the sacraments: they are the instruments of our salvation. This is why the sacraments are necessary for us to get to heaven. Jesus established the Church to dispense the sacraments to every generation. We are not only pardoned for our sins, but we are actually made holy through the sacraments. While Christ alone gains the grace of our salvation, we must cooperate with that grace and participate in our salvation by striving to be holy. This gives glory to God and therefore fulfills the goal of our existence.
